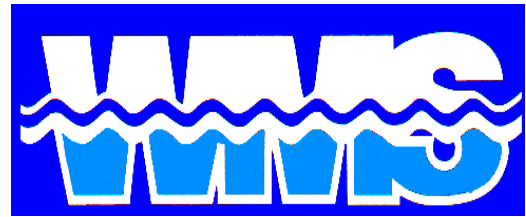

This conference is designed to address some of the issues raised by Checklist 3 of L8 (Page 53), and produce some answers to formulate guidance on each system discussed. The second day will address premises such as care homes and multi-tenanted properties with particular problems, some of which have experienced outbreaks of legionnaires' disease in the past, but all of which could pose a significant risk if not properly managed.

This conference has been designed to bring together high quality speakers from the UK and wider afield to set the scene leading into structured workshops each afternoon.
